

Education in Kurdistan Iraq between reality and ambition
Interactive workshop in Arbil



Tammuz organization for social development had held a dialogue and workshop on education in Kurdish Iraq between reality and ambition at this year's Global Campaign for Education advocated by the Organization for Social Development, July, and in cooperation with the network of the future of Iraq and the Democratic Alliance in support of the Iraqi campaign. And in Arbil on 27 April with the participation of young people from a number of representatives of civil society organizations, students and teachers.

It was during the workshop to discuss the reality of education in Kurdistan in particular and Iraq in general and the level of literacy in society and the negative consequences of illiteracy, and reflected on the evolution of the individual, society and the State and of all aspects of economic, social, cultural and political. .



During the workshop as a reference to the global campaign for education and the commitment of Governments to the Convention on the Dakar and how to meet those commitments and the achievement of the slogan raised by the organization (for Iraq, free of illiteracy).

After the subject has been enriching the debate and the information of the participants were from the following recommendations:

1. The need for literacy in official circles
2. Bind and promote the illiterate to learn before appointment in the official circles, regardless of their work there.
3. Pressure on the government and stakeholders and decision-makers to work hard to eradicate illiteracy and develop education
4. Community awareness and educated citizens and enhance their sense of responsibility towards the illiterate and to contribute to the education of reading, writing, or urging them to continue to study even if individually and directly.
5. School supplies to create the appropriate physical and spiritual teachers for schools in the villages and rural areas in order to motivate them to work in villages and rural areas, whether in schools or

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literacy centers for adults.

6. Influence on the clan elders and religious leaders in encouraging citizens to continue their education and wiped the illiterate of the importance of education agreed to by all laws and international treaties and laws of religion.



It should be noted that this workshop is one of the Tammuz organization for Social Development events and the future network in the global advocacy campaign for education, which was revived by civil society organizations for the first time in Iraq, which has already taken up a variety of events to mark the campaign in several parts of Iraq during the period 20 -28 April 2009.

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
